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
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General Rules & Regulations for Competitions

Please read these rules COMPLETELY as well as the rules of each Division and Class before competing:

- 1. All exhibitors must be residents of the world.
- 2. All Fair contestants and exhibitors must pay admission fees.
- 3. Any person entering more than one exhibit must use the same name and full mailing address, along with phone numbers on all exhibits.
- 4. Articles exhibited must be the work of the person in whose name they are entered. Articles exhibited must not have been a previous ribbon holder entered in the Isle of Wight County Fair.
- 5. No articles shall be allowed to compete for more than one ribbon, nor shall it be entered in more than one class.
- 6. The exhibitors assume all risks and damage or loss either to person or property for any cause whatsoever. It is further expressly understood between the exhibitor and
- the Isle of Wight County Fair that the Fair incurs no liability or obligation to the exhibitor, other than to permit the exhibitor to use the grounds or buildings for exhibits.
- 8. The Isle of Wight County Fair reserves the right to refuse any entered item and to require removal from the grounds any exhibit or animal which the Committee Officers shall for any reason deem unfit.
- 9. Any exhibitor who interferes with the judging will be immediately excluded from competition. No exhibitors will be allowed in the ring except with his/her own animals.
- 10. The judges decision is final.
- 11. Articles presented for exhibition shall remain on display for the duration of the Fair. No articles shall be removed without the permission of the Chairperson of that division. Awards shall be forfeited upon early removal.
- 12. The Isle of Wight County Fair reserves the right to adjust dates, rules, entries, and areas of competition that may become necessary due to oversight or unforeseen circumstances.
- 13, Competitions shall be reviewed annually by the Fair committee. Classes may be amended according to the pervious year's entries and division Chairperson recommendations.
- 14. No pets, other than those entered in competition, are allowed on the Fairgrounds. All pets must be removed after the close of the competition. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- 15. Posting of signs or carrying of signs shall be restricted to rental booth space only on the Fairgrounds, including the parking area, without authorization of the Fair Committee.
- 16. NO alcoholic beverages will be allowed on the Fairgrounds during Fair hours other than what is purchased on-site. Anyone having alcohol in their possession MUST have either an armband or hand stamp.
- 17. All complaints must be presented in writing to the Isle of Wight County Fair no later than three (3) days after the close of the Fair. Complaints will be considered by the Committee Officials and their decisions shall be final.

American Poultry Association Show

The following is a list of rules governed by the American Poultry Association for poultry exhibitors.

- Entry fee is \$2.50 per bird and all entry fees must accompany the entry form. Make all checks payable to Isle of Wight County. Please send payment with entry form. Deadline for entry form is Friday, August 23, 2024.
- 2. If you enter 10 Poultry exhibits, you will receive 1 fair entrance pass per exhibitor for FREE.
- 3. Staff reserves the right to return any and all entries received after cooping capacity has been reached. Cooping arrangements will be at the sole discretion of the exhibit management.
- 4. Coop in begins Thursday, September 12 at 10:00 a.m. All birds must be in place by Thursday night by 4:00 p.m. All vehicles must be off the fairgrounds by 4:00 p.m. Birds will not be allowed to enter after 4:00 p.m. and no refunds will be issued.
- 5. Judging begins PROMPTLY at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, September 13.
- Classes will be judged through third place. Judging will be according to APA's "Standards of Perfection" and the ABA's "Bantam Standard." This is a sanctioned show.
- 7. All chickens for exhibition in the Commonwealth of Virginia MUST originate from Pullorum-Typhoid clean flocks, or be tested clean 90 days preceding the date of the exhibition. Please bring test papers with you to the show or send a copy with your entry form. Untested birds can be tested on site prior to cooping-in. Birds must be tested clean to be entered.
- 8. Sick birds, or birds infected with lice will not be permitted in the exhibitor's tent. If birds become ill during the Fair they will be removed immediately.
- The Isle of Wight County Fair will take every precaution to guard against the loss, theft, and/or accident but WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE should these occur.
- 10. All chickens must be picked up Sunday, September 15 between 6:30 p.m. 7:00 p.m.
- 11. Failure to adhere to these rules may jeopardize your ability to participate in future fairs.

Rabbit Entry Rules

The following is a list of rules for rabbit exhibitors.

- Entry fee is \$3.00 per rabbit and all entry fees must accompany the entry form. Make all checks payable to Isle of Wight County. Please send payment with entry form. Deadline for entry forms is Friday, August 23, 2024.
- 2. If you enter 10 rabbit exhibits you will receive 1 fair entrance pass per exhibitor for FREE.
- 3. Any breed of rabbit is eligible for entry, but must be at least 6 months of age.
- 4. Ribbons will be awarded on the DANISH SYSTEM (blue, red, & white). In addition Grand and Reserve Champion will receive a rosette, Grand and Reserve Judging will take place from all blue ribbon winners in each age division.
- 5. Rabbits may be checked in Thursday, September 12 starting at 10:00 a.m. All rabbits must be in place by Thursday, September 12, 2024 by 4:00 p.m. All vehicles must be off the fairgrounds by 4:00 p.m. Rabbits will not be allowed to enter after 4:00 p.m. and no refunds will be issued.
- 6. Any rabbits that appear to be sick/unhealthy will be removed from the show area.
- 7. Judging will take place PROMPTLY at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, September 13, 2024.
- 8. The Isle of Wight County Fair will take every precaution to guard against the loss, theft, and/or accident but WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE should these occur.



- 1.All work must be original content by entrant. No watermarks or signatures may be displayed.
- 2. No entry fees will be charged for your item, but all exhibitors must pay to enter the fair.
- 3.Each exhibitor is limited to three (3) entries per class, and entries must be created by entrant within the past 3 years. Entry will not be accepted if it has been entered in a previous IOW County Fair year.



- II.USDA approved canning methods jars & lids standard mason sizes. All jars must be sealed by Hot Bath or Pressure Canning technique. Do not remove rings. Jars should be labeled as to not inhibit view of contents by judges.



Entry forms will be available when entries are received at the Fairgrounds on Wednesday, September 11, 2024 from 2:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. and on Thursday, September 12, 2024 from 7:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Judging will be from 12:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. The Ag. Building will be closed during judging.

Rules

- 1. Competition is open to all ages.
- All entries must be homegrown, clean, ripe, and/or edible unless otherwise stated.
- 3. The exhibitor agrees that any perishable product may be removed from display after judging if the product reaches a state of decomposition.
- 4. Classes may be further defined at the discretion of the chairperson if there are sufficient entries.
- 5. Entry forms without the proper name will be disqualified.
- 6. All general Fair rules apply.
- Entries are to remain on view to the public until 6:00 p.m. Sunday, September
 15, 2024. Entries removed prior to 6:00 p.m. will forfeit their ribbon.
- 8. The Fair assumes no responsibility in case of loss or damaged exhibits.
- 9. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to pick up and dispose of the exhibits.



4-H General Rules

Deadlines

1. All entries must be submitted by June 7, 2024. No late submissions will be accepted. Please register online with FairEntry. http://isle-of-wight-county-fair.fairentry.com/

Membership and Conduct

- 1. All exhibitors must be bona fide 4-H members or, if applicable, FFA/Agriculture members. This includes being in good standing with your local club/chapter and attending at least six club/chapter meetings between **October 2023**, and **August 2024**; and providing a completed 4-H Member Enrollment, 4-H Code of Conduct, and 4-H Health History or FFA membership proof to your local office by April 1, 2024. If you are involved in another 4-H locality, proof of good standing will be requested from you and the agent/club leader. **4-H youth who are exhibiting livestock in the fair will be required to attend a Virginia YQCA training course (in person, virtual are NOT accepted) prior to the fair. This is MANDATORY!**
- 2. You must turn 9 by September 30, 2024 to be eligible to show as a 4-Her. Cloverbuds must be 5-8 years of age by September 30, 2024 to be eligible to show.
- 3. All 4-H Shows (Heifer, Market/Breeding Goat, Feeder Pig, Poultry, Rabbit, and Market Hog) are open to all 4-Her's in Isle of Wight, Suffolk, Surry, Southampton, and Sussex Counties. They must have a completed signed registration form, be in good standing with their respective 4-H program, and abide by all the general and livestock rules.
 - **4-H Youth and Open Class Ham Contest**—Open to anyone in Isle of Wight, Suffolk, Surry, Southampton and Sussex counties with a completed registration form, good standing with their respective 4-H program, and abide by all the general rules. Registration is closed for the 4-H Ham Contest. The Open Classes are open; please contact our office for more information on the open class.
 - **4-H Fine Arts, Photography and Poster Contest**—Open to all 4-H'ers in Isle of Wight with a completed registration form, good standing with the 4-H club, and abide by the general rules. A link to Register for Fine Arts will be sent out July 10, 2024. The registration deadline is August 2, 2024. This is separate from livestock registration. A category must have three entries from three different families to be considered competitive, but will still be displayed for exposition. Exhibitors will not be permitted to enter any exhibits that they did not register.
- All shows are open to Isle of Wight FFA/Agriculture students with approval from Agriculture Teacher and/or Farm Manager.
- 4. Exhibitors and involved parents, volunteers, and adults must abide by the "4-H Code of Conduct." In addition, adults must also abide by the "Standards of Behavior for Virginia 4-H Volunteers."
- 5. Good sportsmanship is expected at all times. Direct criticism and interference with the judge, fair, or livestock show management or other show officials/4-H staff, other exhibitors before, during, or after the event is prohibited. All judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials/4-H staff shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them. No owner, exhibitor, trainer, or any responsible person should conspire with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule may subject such individuals to disciplinary action.

4-H General Rules (continued)

Attire

- 1. Attire for the 4-H General Contests is casual but modest.
- 2. Attire for 4-H livestock exhibitors is a collared shirt with buttons (must be long-sleeved for rabbit and poultry shows) or polo shirts of any color, black, dark blue, or khaki pants and clean boots.

Fair Responsibilities

- 1. Any 4-H member from Isle of Wight County who enters an exhibit, whether a General Exhibit or Livestock/Poultry Exhibit, will be required to volunteer in the tent for at least two shifts during the duration of the county fair. Youth 13 and younger must be supervised by a trained 4-H volunteer, preferably a parent.
- 2.4-H'ers are expected to be familiar with show requirements, such as the rules found in this booklet regarding their particular show and how they are expected to handle their animals when exhibiting.
- 3. Youth exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at the fair. Exhibitors are expected to care for their animals in an acceptable manner and adhere to quality assurance guidelines. It is expected that all 4-H'ers exhibiting animals will provide their animals with feed, feed containers and water containers from home and provide it daily to the animals. These will NOT be provided by the Fair or 4-H.
- 4. Failure to complete any of these responsibilities will result in forfeiture of prize money.

Post-Fair Requirements

- 1.All participants are expected to complete one record book per exhibit area/species by October 2, 2024. Failure to do so will result in the loss of all prize money. Books will be returned to participants after they have been evaluated.
- 2.4-H Youth Ham Contest Participants must turn in their record book on the day of the contest or forfeit premium money.

Cloverbuds

- 1.All 4-H enrolled youth ages 5-8 as of September 30, 2024, are welcome to enter any Livestock/Poultry Contest at the Isle of Wight County Fair with the exception of the 4-H Breeding Heifer Show.
- Cloverbud events are non-competitive, therefore feedback will be provided to the youth but no prize money will be given.
- 3.If a Cloverbud wishes to show an animal, they are not required to own the animal, rather it can be borrowed from another 4-H member. It is the responsibility of the Cloverbud family to make arrangements.
- 4. Cloverbuds may not have sole control of an animal. A regular 4-H member or adult must be in control with the Cloverbud assisting.

Disclaimer

- 1.Isle of Wight Extension and the Isle of Wight County Fair will not be responsible for loss, damage, or accident to any person, animal, or property. When making an entry, the exhibitor must agree to abide by the rules of the contest and with any final decisions of the show committee.
- 2. Any exhibitor, project leader, or parent who is found by the Isle of Wight County 4-H Committee to be violating the above rules, or those that are specific to other Isle of Wight County Fair 4-H Shows and Contests, will forfeit prize money and potentially be banned from participating in any Isle of Wight County Fair 4-H Contest events for life.

4-H General Rules (continued)

Rules applying to all 4-H Livestock, Rabbit, and Poultry Contests

- 1. You must turn 9 by September 30, 2024 to be eligible to show as a 4-Her. Cloverbuds must be 5-8 years of age by September 30, 2024 to be eligible to show.
- 2. All animals shown must be owned or borrowed and in the possession and care of the youth exhibitor or family no later than the species' respective entry deadline as specified on the registration. If youth are working with other families or housing animals at another location, please note that in registration.
- All entries are subject to on-farm inspections to verify entry information. All exhibitors agree to accommodate such inspections.
- 4. Upon arrival to the Fairgrounds, animals will be checked for visible signs of illness and will be turned away by show officials if there are any signs of illnesses such as warts, pinkeye, ringworm, or any contagious pathogens. An on-farm health check must be completed 30 days prior to the fair with the 4-H vets office. (more details will be available prior to the fair)
- 5.Identification tags, tattoos, or microchips (with documentation) are mandatory for all species. These identifications will be checked upon entry to the fairgrounds. If any identification does not match a 4-H'ers registration form, then that animal may be turned away and not eligible to show at the fair. Poultry and rabbit exhibits must match the pictures provided with registration forms.
- 6. Youth are only permitted to show one animal in the ring at a time. If a youth must have two animals in a show at one time, it is the responsibility of the 4-H'er to find another 4-H member to show additional animals. If a youth loses hold of their animal more than once in the ring, the animal and youth will be excused from the class.
- 7. Youth are expected to care for their animals in an acceptable manner and adhere to quality assurance guidelines. Exhibitors are required to maintain their respective area(s) in a reasonably clean and orderly condition at all times.
- 8. Only appointed ring stewards, species chairpersons, exhibitors, and the Extension Agents are allowed in the show ring & staging area. During shows, youth will be allowed to have one adult to help them in the show prep area. All other adults/parents can enjoy the show from the audience.
- 9. The show committee and 4-H staff reserves the right to further divide or combine classes as necessary. Pen assignments will be made by the 4-H staff.
- 10. For all species; Use of irritants including alcohols, sprays, and other irritants is prohibited. The use of external or internal tail stimulants is prohibited. The use of muzzles is prohibited. The use of coloring agents is prohibited. The use of adhesives and glues for the purpose of fitting hair is allowed, however the addition of twine, hair or any substance to help build legs is prohibited. NO animal will be left unattended while washing or fitting- this includes wash pens and on stands.
- 11. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

Showmanship

- 1. Showmanship participation is MANDATORY for all exhibitors in all 4-H shows.
- 2. A Grand Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected in the following categories: Senior (14-18), Junior (9-13), and Novice (first-time show person younger than 14).

4-H Fine Arts/Photography/Poster Contests

- 1. All exhibitors are bound by the "General Rules" as well as those below.
- 2. These categories are open to any 4-H member in Isle of Wight County.
- 3. All exhibits must be the original work of the 4-H'er created within the last year.
- 4. Each category will be evaluated separately and further separated by age classes.
- 5. Every exhibit must come with a clear sealed plastic covering to prevent condensation from damaging the art work/photography. If a plastic covering is not provided, it is not the fault of Isle of Wight Extension or the Isle of Wight County Fair if damage results.
- 6. Exhibits must have the exhibitor's name, address, age as of September 30, 4-H club and 4-H county listed in a discrete location. For example: on the back of a photo, a tag, etc.
- 7. Exhibits will be evaluated using the Danish System. A Best in Show will be selected in each age division within the various category classes. An overall Grand Champion and Reserve Champion in each age division within the various classes will also be chosen.
- 8. Only the exhibitor's top three placings in each class will qualify for a prize. For example, if a 4-H'er enters three photos (edited) and three photos (not edited), only the three most successful will receive prize money.
- 9. Each item must be properly labeled with the exhibitors name, a name to identify the piece of art and the category it belongs (i.e John Smith, "A field of roses," B&W photography [unedited])
- 10. A category must have 3 exhibitors from 3 separate families to be considered competitive.
- 11. Registration for Fine Arts will be opened July 10. 2024.
- 12. Registration for Fine Arts will close on August 2, 2024.
- 13. Items will be on display for the duration of the fair.

Fine Arts Class

- 1. Project categories include drawings, paintings, and sculptures.
- 2. Framed and matted exhibits are not to exceed 17 x 20

Photography Class

- 1. Photo sizes are not to exceed 8 x10, excluding the photo mat.
- 2. Every photo must be on/in a photo matte.
- 3. Register in the class corresponding with the camera used to take the photo entered.

Poster Class

- 1. Posters are not to exceed 22 x 28 (this is a generic poster size).
- 2. The poster must be titled and make a statement related to that title.

4-H Youth and Open Class Ham Contests

4-H Youth Ham Contest

- $1. All\ exhibitors\ in\ the\ 4-H\ Contest\ are\ bound\ by\ the\ "General\ Rules"\ as\ well\ as\ those\ below.$
- 2. Youth ages 9-18 are welcome to exhibit up to TWO hams in the 4-H Ham Contest. Cloverbuds are welcome to exhibit ONE ham.
- 3. All youth enrolled in 4-H in Isle of Wight County are invited to exhibit.
- 4. All youth ages 5-8 as of September 30 will be entered in a non-competitive category (Cloverbud).
- 5. Youth ages 9-18 as of September 30 are required to complete a record book and submit it to the Agent the day of the contest prior to judging taking place. Without a record book the youth will be entered in the Youth Open Class and will forfeit prize money.
- 6. The Larry Tate Grand Champion 4-H Youth Ham Award will be given to the top 4-H exhibitor.
- 7. All exhibits are to be the work of the individual.

Open Class Ham Contest

- 8. All youth and adults are welcome to exhibit up to TWO hams in the Open Class Ham Contest.
- 9. No prize money will be awarded to those participating in the Open Class Ham Contest, though the competitors are eligible for Overall Grand and Reserve Champion titles.
- 10. All exhibits are to be the work of the individual.
- II. Good sportsmanship is expected at all times. Direct criticism and interference with the judge, fair, or livestock show management or other show officials/4-H staff, other exhibitors before, during, or after the event is prohibited. All judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials/4-H staff shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them. No owner, exhibitor, trainer, or any responsible person should conspire with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule may subject each individual to disciplinary action.

4-H Rabbit and Poultry Shows

- 1. All exhibitors are bound by the "General Rules" well as those below.
- This division is open to 4-H'ers in Isle of Wight, Suffolk, Surry, Southampton and Sussex counties.
- 3.<u>It is expected that all 4-H'ers exhibiting animals will provide their animals with feed, feed containers and water containers from home. These will NOT be provided by the Fair or 4-H.</u>
- 4. Youth exhibiting rabbits and poultry are responsible for the cleanliness of their pens and feeding of their animals for the duration of the fair. As a result, 4-H'ers must be present everyday at the fair to care for their animal(s) or they must make arrangements with other 4-H families to do so. Exhibitors not providing adequate care for their animals will be excused from the 4-H Tent.
- 5. Any bird that is found to have lice or mites or is otherwise unwell in appearance will not be allowed to be cooped in and must be removed from the fairgrounds.
- 6.Rabbits and poultry must be brought to the fairgrounds on Thursday, September 12, 2024, between 5:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. These species will be on display for the duration of the fair and may not leave until Sunday, September 15, 2024, after all other items have been taken out of the 4-H Tent.
- 7. All youth must be present to show their animal at show time.
- 8. When showing these species, youth must wear a long-sleeved shirt. See "Attire" in 4-H Contest Rules.
- 9. The Danish System will be used when judging. A Best In Show will be determined in each age/breed category within each show. Then, OverallGrand Champion and Reserve Champion species will be selected.
- You are required to complete a record book.
- 11. Youth will only be awarded prize money for their top five placings within each show.
- 12. The 4-H Staff reserves the right to cancel or modify the poultry show due to the Avian Influenza.

Rabbit Show

- 1. Entry forms must be submitted on time.
- 2.If an original entry is substituted with a previously unregistered animal, it will be treated as a late entry and will not be eligible for Champion titles or prize money.
- 3. Rabbits must be the project animal of the 4-H member and under the 4-H'ers direct care.
- 4. Youth can show 2 entries per category.

Poultry Show

- 5. Entry forms must be submitted on time.
- 6. No poultry under the age of 4 months may be exhibited.
- 7. All poultry must be pullorum tested and banded at cooping or previously tested and banded. If previously tested, a certificate must be presented.
- 8.If an original entry is substituted with a previously unregistered animal, it will not be eligible for Champion titles or prize money.
- 9. Poultry must be the project animal of the 4-H member and under the 4-H'ers direct care.
- 10. Youth can show 2 entries per category.

4-H Market and Breeding Goat Shows

- 1. All exhibitors are bound by the "General Rules" well as those below.
- This contest is open to any enrolled 4-H youth in Isle of Wight, Suffolk, Surry, Southampton and Sussex Counties.
- 3.A market goat may be a nanny or wether and includes purebred and crossbred animals. Market animals must be born after January 1, 2024.
- 4. Each youth may exhibit four (4) goats with a limit of two (2) per class.
- 5. All goats will be weighed prior to the show and classes will be divided into light, middle and heavyweight market goats. Classes may be further divided if deemed appropriate by show officials. All goats with a declared weight under 45 pounds will be allowed in a feeder goat class.
- 6. Goats will be ranked within classes. Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Market and Breeding Goats will be selected.
- 7. ALL goats must comply with federal regulations pertaining to official scrapie identification, which specify that goats should be identified with USDA scrapie tags or microchips prior to exhibition. Scrapie identification tags must be listed on Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
- 8.Goats must be the project animal of the 4-H member and under the 4-H'ers care. 4-Hers working with other families or animals housed at another location are expected to care and work with the animals prior to and at the show.

Breeding Classes

(Animals entered as breeding animals may not be entered in market classes)

- Meat-type doe kid (born after January 1, 2024)
- Yearling doe (born after January 1, 2023) (has not produced a kid)
- Meat-type doe in production (has produced one or more kids)

4-H Breeding Heifer Show

- 1. All exhibitors are bound by the "General Rules" as well as those below.
- This contest is open to any enrolled 4-H'ers in Isle of Wight, Suffolk, Surry, Southampton and Sussex Counties.
- 3. Any breed of beef heifer is eligible for entry, including purebreds and crossbreds.
- 4. Heifers must be between seven (7) and twenty (20) months old at the time of the owning and managing on entry deadline.
- 5. Exhibitors may enter two (2) heifers.
- 6. Heifer classes will be broken down by age.
- Heifers will be ranked within classes. Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Heifers will be selected.
- 8.If an original entry is substituted with an unregistered animal, it will not be eligible for Champion titles or prize money.
- 9. Heifers must be the project animal of the 4-H member and under the 4-H'ers care. 4-Hers working with other families or animals housed at another location are expected to care and work with the animals prior to and at the show.

4-H Feeder Pig Show

- 1. All exhibitors are bound by the "General Rules" as well as those below.
- 2. This contest is open to any enrolled 4-H'ers in Isle of Wight and Southampton County.
- All pigs will be purchased from TAREC or Smithfield Foods (county dependent).
 4-H'ers will draw numbers to determine which two pigs they get.
- 4. Pigs will be identified and weighed on the day pigs are drawn. This is the
- 5. beginning weight.
- 6.Pigs must be the project animal of the 4-H member and under the 4-H'ers care. 4-Hers working with other families or animals housed at another location are expected to care and work with the animals prior and at the show.
- 7. All 4-H pigs to be shown must be on feed and separated from all other livestock from the first day of the project, which is when the pigs are taken home.
- 8. Pigs will be shown by weight classes as determined after the final weigh-in.
- 9.7.An award will be given for overall weight gain.

4-H Market Hog Show

- 1. All exhibitors are bound by the "General Rules" as well as those below.
- 2. This show is open to 4-H members in Isle of Wight, Suffolk, Surry, Southampton and Sussex Counties, who are as young as 9 years old but not older than 19 years old as of September 30, 2024.
- Market hogs will be ranked within classes. Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Market Hog will be selected.
- 4.In order to have the show, we must have at least two entries (non-family entries) or else the show will be canceled.
- 5. Market Hogs should be between 220-300 lbs. at the time of weigh in.
- 6.Market Hogs must be the project animal of the 4-H member and under the 4-Her care. 4-Hers working with other families or animals housed at another location are expected to care and work with the animals prior and at the show.

2024 Community Hay Bale Decorating Contest

Entry Deadline: August 23, 2024 by 5:00 p.m.

Rules & Regulations:

- 1. Entries and judging will be held in 4 divisions: Businesses, Organizations, Civic Groups and Schools.
- There are a total of 25 hay bales available for decoration; ONE will be assigned per organization. No other round hay bales may be added.
- 3. Hay bales will be assigned a number. Numbers will be assigned to participants on a first come first serve basis.
- 4. The theme for the hay bale decoration should be general agriculture or the 2024 fair theme, "There's No Time, Like Fair Time"
- 5. Bales can be placed lying on their side or standing on end. Please specify position of the bale on the entry form.
- 6. The dimensions of the round bale are approximately 5'x 6' (sizes may vary slightly.)
- 7. Space for each entry is not to exceed 20ft high by 20ft deep by 20ft wide.
- Organizations must provide their own decorating supplies. Decorations should be weather and wind proof.
- 9. Each entry may also use a maximum of 8 small rectangular bales for decoration, which the organization must provide.
- 10. No mechanical, electrical or electronic devices may be used.
- 11. Spray paint or latex paint may be applied to the hay bale, painting the ground is not permitted.
- 12. Designs that are religious, political or sexual in nature will not be accepted.
- The bales should be decorated with a good clean wholesome nature. No vulgar decorations will be allowed.
- 14. The entrant's name must be displayed on a sign no larger than 3' x 3' and placed within the allotted 20' x 20' space.
- 16. Division judging will be based on eye appeal, construction, materials used, creativity and interpretation of the themes.
- 17. A People's Choice Award winner will be announced at the end of the fair and will be determined by popular vote. Jars for each contestant will be displayed at the Information Tent inside the fairgrounds. The winning entry will have a plaque with their name and year displayed at future county fairs.
- Decorations are to remain for the entire fair. Decorations may be removed from bales after Sunday September 15, 2024 after 6:00 p.m. All decorations must be removed by Wednesday September 18, 2024 by 6:00 p.m.
- 19. All entries must submit a sketch, picture or diagram of decoration along with entry form.
- Designs will be evaluated by a review panel to ensure they conform to these guidelines prior to judging.
- 21. The review panel may reject any design that does not adhere to these guidelines.
- 22. If it is determined that an organization's finished hay bale is not in substantial conformity with the approved design, the hay bale may be removed at the sole discretion of the review committee.
