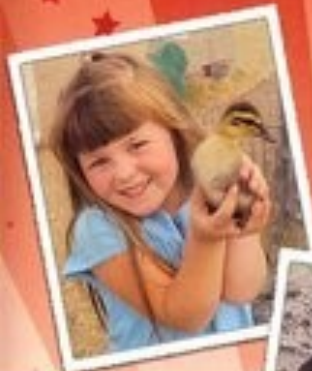

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General Rules and Regulations for Competitions

Please read these rules COMPLETELY as well as the rules of each Division and Class before competing:

1. All exhibitors must be residents of the world.
2. All Fair contestants and exhibitors must pay admission fees.
3. Any person entering more than one exhibit must use the same name and full mailing address, along with phone numbers on all exhibits.
4. Articles exhibited must be the work of the person in whose name they are entered.
5. Articles exhibited must not have been a previous ribbon holder entered in the Isle of Wight County Fair.
6. No articles shall be allowed to compete for more than one ribbon, nor shall it be entered in more than one class.
7. The exhibitors assume all risks and damage or loss either to person or property for any cause whatsoever. It is further expressly understood between the exhibitor and the Isle of Wight County Fair that said Fair incurs no liability or obligation to the exhibitor, other than to permit the exhibitor to use the grounds or buildings for exhibits.
8. The Isle of Wight County Fair reserves the right to refuse any entered item and to require removal from the grounds any exhibit or animal which the Committee Officers shall for any reason deem unfit.
9. Any exhibitor who interferes with the judging will be immediately excluded from competition. No exhibitors will be allowed in the ring except with his/her own animals.
10. The judges decision is final.
11. Articles presented for exhibition shall remain on display for the duration of the Fair. No articles shall be removed without the permission of the Chairperson of that division. Awards shall be forfeited upon early removal.
12. The Isle of Wight County Fair reserves the right to adjust dates, rules, entries and areas of competition that may become necessary due to oversight or unforeseen circumstances.
13. Competitions shall be reviewed annually by the Fair committee. Classes may be amended according to the previous year's entries and Division chair recommendations.
14. No pets, other than those entered in competition, are allowed on the Fairgrounds. All pets must be removed after the close of the competition. This rule will be enforced strictly.
15. Posting of signs or carrying of signs shall be restricted to rental booth space only on the Fairgrounds, including the parking area, without authorization of the Fair Committee.
16. NO alcoholic beverages will be allowed on the Fairgrounds during Fair hours. Other than what is purchased at beer tents. Anyone having beer in their possession MUST have either an armband or hand stamp.
17. All complaints must be presented in writing to the Isle of Wight County Fair no later than three (3) days after the close of the Fair. Complaints will be considered by the Committee Officials and their decisions shall be final.

Poultry and Rabbit Competition Information



Open Poultry Exhibit

The following is a list of rules for poultry exhibitors.

1. Entry fee is \$1.50 per bird and all entry fees must accompany entry. Make all checks payable to Isle of Wight County. Please send payment with entry form.
2. NO PHONE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.
3. Staff reserves the right to return any and all entries received after cooping capacity has been reached. Cooping arrangements will be at the sole discretion of the exhibit management.
4. Coop in begins Thursday, September 15th at 12:00 noon. All birds must be in place by Thursday night at 9:00 p.m.
5. Judging begins PROMPTLY at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, September 16th.
6. Classes will be judged through third place. Judging will be according to AIPs "Standard of Perfection" and the ABAs "BANTAM STANDARD."
Premiums areas follows:
First Place.....\$3
Second Place.....\$2
Third Place..... \$1
7. All chickens for exhibition in the Commonwealth of Virginia MUST originate from Pullorum-Typhoid clean flocks, or be tested clean ninety (90) days preceding the date of exhibition. Please bring test papers with you to the show or send a copy with your entry form. Untested birds can be tested on site prior to cooping-in. Birds must be tested clean to be entered.
8. Sick birds, or birds infected with lice will not be permitted in the exhibitor's tent. If birds become ill during the Fair they will be removed immediately.
9. Care, water and feeding of birds will be provided by Fair staff.
10. The Isle of Wight County Fair will take every precaution to guard against the loss, theft and/or accident but WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE should these occur. The Committee looks forward to receiving your entries.
11. All chickens must be picked up Sunday, September 18th after 6pm.

Rabbit Entry Rules

The following is a list of rules for poultry exhibitors.

1. Entry fee is \$2.50 per rabbit and all entry fees must accompany entry. Make all checks payable to Isle of Wight County. Please send payment with entry form.
2. NO PHONE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.
3. Any breed of rabbit is eligible for entry, but must be at least 6 months of age.
4. Ribbons will be awarded on the DANISH SYSTEM (Blue, red, & white). In addition Grand and Reserve Champion will receive a rosette, Grand & Reserve Judging will take place from all blue ribbon winners in each age division.
5. Rabbits may be checked in Wednesday, September 14th starting at 12:00 p.m. ALL RABBITS MUST BE IN PLACE BY WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 14, 2011 BY 9:00 P.M.
6. Any rabbits that appear to be sick/unhealthy will be removed from the show area.
7. Judging will take place promptly at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, September 16, 2011.
8. All rabbits must be picked up on Sunday, September 18, 2011 after 6pm.
9. No breeding of animals will be permitted on the Isle of Wight County Fairgrounds.
10. Care, water and feeding of the rabbits will be provided by Fair Staff.
11. Please bring your own water bottle for each rabbit.
12. The Isle of Wight County Fair will take every precaution to guard against loss, theft, and/or accident, but WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE should these occur. The committee looks forward to receiving your entries.

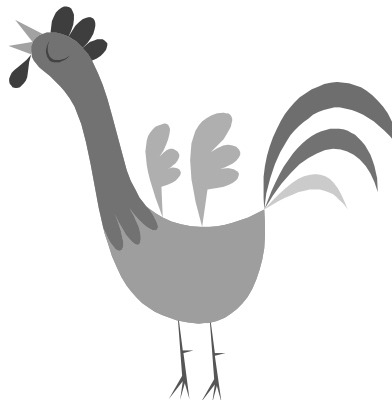

1. No entry fees will be charged for your item, but all exhibitors must pay to enter the Fair.
2. Each exhibitor is limited to 10 entries.
3. On site registration will take place the following days at the Fair Ground Site:
 Saturday, September 10, 2011—10:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m.
 Tuesday, September 13, 2011—3:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m.
 Wednesday, September 14, 2011—8:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m.
 Registration will be held at the Heritage Tent (weather permitting). The Fairgrounds address is 21311 Courthouse Highway, Windsor, Virginia, 23487.
4. Items can be picked up at 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, September 18, 2011. Any items left after 7:00 p.m. will be taken to the Isle of Wight County Parks and Recreation Office at Carrollton Nike Park. **Awarded ribbons will be forfeited if entry is picked up prior to 6:00 p.m.**
5. All items must be homemade by the exhibitor and completed within the last three years. Entries CAN NOT be previous ribbon winners.
6. Exhibitors will receive their entry tag at time of registration check-in.
7. All entries will be listed according to what section it qualifies in. The exhibitor is responsible for deciding the proper section. **Framing (inexpensive) is recommended for pictures and paintings. Also recommended are hangers to be attached to back of exhibit.**
8. The Arts and Crafts Committee will set up all exhibits. No exhibitor will be allowed to set up, handle, or rearrange their entry.
9. Every possible care will be taken to protect the exhibits. The Isle of Wight County Fair assumes no responsibility in case of lost or damaged to exhibits from any cause; upon this condition only are entries received. Any insurance desired must be carried by the exhibitor.
10. Judge's decision is FINAL.

Can Goods, Baked Goods & Candy Competition

Entry Dates & Times

Canned good entries can be received Saturday, September 10th from 10:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. and Tuesday, September 13th from 3:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m. in the Heritage tent located on the Joel C. Bradshaw Fairgrounds in Windsor, Virginia. Entries for **all** food competitions can be brought to the Heritage Tent on Wednesday, September 14th between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Judging will start promptly at 2:00 pm on Wednesday. There will be no contestants allowed in or near the Heritage Tent during judging. The tent will open at 4:00pm on Thursday, September 15th. Canned goods entries must be removed Sunday, September 18th after 6:00 p.m. and no later than 7:30 pm. All baked goods will be disposed of on Sunday after the fair as they are no longer safe for consumption. Please bring all baked goods and candy on disposable trays and cover well (preferably a large zip lock bag). The Fair will not be responsible for broken dishes.

Ribbons and Prizes

RIBBONS WILL BE AWARDED IN EACH CATEGORY according to total points. There will also be one ribbon awarded in each category for Best In Class, as well as a ribbon for Best In Show. The Best In Show ribbon will be given to the entry with the most unusual, original or not judged exhibit, not necessarily the one who received the highest score but the one that was actually "BEST IN SHOW"! There will also be a Chairman's Choice Ribbon awarded to the Chairman's Favorite. Good luck!

Point Scale

100 Points—First Place—Blue Ribbon
90-99 Points—Second Place—Red Ribbon
80-89 Points—Third Place—White Ribbon
79 & Below—Participation—Green Ribbon

Junior Division—Baked Goods Only (does not include the Angel Food Cake Contest)

The Junior Division of the Baked Goods Competition will be divided into two (2) age groups. They will be:

- 9 & under
- 10-15 years of age.

Any entry for ages 16 and over will be judged in regular adult competition.

Decorated Cake Category Only

This category is judged based on appearance only. The cakes will not be tasted. Box cake mixes are allowed for this category only.

NO MEMBER OF THE FOODS COMMITTEE WILL BE ALLOWED TO ENTER EXHIBITS FOR JUDGING.

Food Preservation—Canned Goods

Section Rules:

1. USDA approved canning jars & lids required (Standard Mason Jar/Similar)
2. All jars must be sealed with jar lids and rings. The rings should not be removed.
3. Jars must not have any kind of labeling. Information for the canned item will be on the judging form.
4. Food should be canned in clear standard canning mason jars and **MUST BE canned within the last year.**
5. Any jars may be opened at the discretion of the judges.
6. The fair will not be responsible for lost or damaged exhibits.
7. Exhibitors do not have to be present at the time of judging.

ALL CANNED FOODS THAT ARE NOT PROCESSED ACCORDING TO USDA RECOMMENDATIONS OR THAT DO NOT MEET SAFE CANNING STANDARDS WILL BE AUTOMATICALLY DISQUALIFIED FOR JUDGING!

Judging Criteria

Quality (Judging by Appearance) 60 points

- Uniformity—Size, shape and color
- Pack-Full with right proportion of solids and liquids.
- Must have a correct amount of head space

Quality of liquid 30 points

- Free from sediment, clear natural color
- No food color

Appearance of Jar 10 Points

- Jar must be clean, clear, and free from nicks.
- Lids must be rust free with no dents or nicks

TOTAL 100 POINTS

Jar Sizes for Each Category:

Canned Vegetables-Quart or pint Jars

Canned Fruits-Quart or pint jars

Pickles-Quart or pint jars

Relish- Quart, pint or half pint jars

Jams, Jelly and Preserves- Pint or half pint jars

Miscellaneous Category:

Examples are: Herbal vinegar, pecans canned in syrup, other unusual or unique canned foods that do not fall into any of the previous categories.

Baked Goods

Section Rules:

1. All baked goods become property of the Isle of Wight County Fair
2. Commercially prepared mixes, pie shells, fillings or dough may not be used except in decorated cake competition.
3. RECIPE must be submitted with all baked goods. Entries without recipe will not be accepted.
4. All baked goods must be submitted on disposable plates or tins and covered or sealed with clear plastic wrap or sealable (Ziploc) bags.
5. Please make sure that you submit the quantity indicated for each category.
6. Exhibitors are not allowed in the tent during judging.

Judging Criteria

Appearance -Shape, Size, Rounded, Even	15 points
Crust -Color, Crispness, Thickness, Flaky	15 points
Crumb - Texture, Lightness, Moist, Color	30 Points
Flavor - Taste, texture, Moist	40 Points
TOTAL	100 POINTS

Decorated Cakes

Section Rules:

1. All decorated cakes become property of the Isle of Wight County Fair.
2. Commercially prepared mixes are allowed for this category.
3. Recipes are not required for this category. However, if your cake or icing is home-made and you want to submit the recipe you may do so on an index/recipe card. If you submit a recipe card you must also submit a waiver form.
4. All cakes must be submitted on disposable plates or tins and covered or sealed with clear plastic wrap or sealable (Ziploc) bags.

Judging Criteria

Shape -Symmetrical, Level	25 Points
Color - Vivid, Vibrant	25 points
Presentation - Display	10 points
Decorating - Flowers, Borders, Writing	<u>40 Points</u>
Total	100 Points

Quantities:

You must submit one whole cake for this category. Half cakes or cupcakes will not be accepted.

Candy

Section Rules:

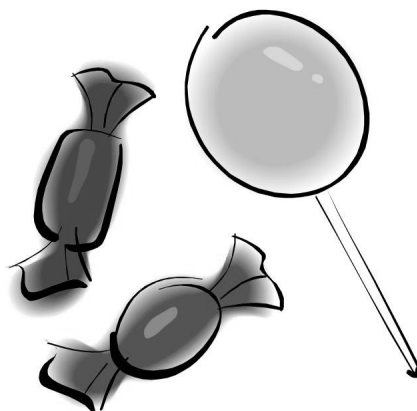
1. All candy becomes property of the Isle of Wight County Fair
2. Commercially prepared mixes are not allowed.
3. RECIPES must be submitted with all candies on an index/recipe card. Entries without recipes will not be accepted.
4. All candy must be submitted on disposable plates or tins and covered or sealed with clear plastic wrap or sealable (Ziploc) bags.
5. Please make sure that you submit the quantity indicated for each category.

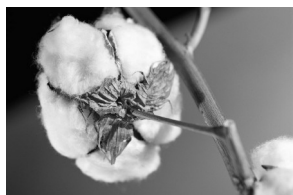

(Rules are based on the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association)

1. The tournament will be held Saturday, September 17, 2011. Registration will begin starting August 1, 2011—September 12, 2011 between 8:30 a.m.-5:00 p.m., or you can register online at WWW.IWUS.NET. There will be registrations taken the day of the tournament, but space is limited in each division so it will be on a First Come, First Serve basis. The tournament is set to begin at 10:30 a.m.
2. The tournament is divided into two play divisions (singles & doubles) male and female will play together in the singles and doubles division.
3. The singles and doubles rounds will be double elimination. Trophies will be given to the 1st and 2nd place Champions for each category.
4. Minimum and maximum number of contestants and partners per division are singles (4 min/64 max) and doubles (4 min/32 max)
5. Play of Game
 - A. The game is broken down into innings. Each inning consists of four pitched shoes, two by each contestant.
 - B. Value of the Shoe
 - i. Ringer— A ringer is a shoe, which comes to rest encircling the stake. A straightedge touching either points or any part of the heel calks of the shoe must be declared a ringer (3 points)
 - ii. A shoe in count— A shoe in count, which is not a ringer but comes to rest with any portion of it within 6 inches of any part of the stake, is a shoe in count. (1 point)
 - iii. A leaner— A leaner or any other shoe which is touching a stake (but not a ringer) is considered a shoe in count.

Apply to all 4-H livestock shows unless otherwise indicated.

1. All entries are due **June 17, 2011** (postmarked) unless otherwise indicated.
2. All exhibitors are required to abide by the "Showing Character in Livestock Projects" curriculum.
3. Upon arrival to the Fairgrounds, animals will be checked for visible signs of disease and will be turned away by show officials if there are any signs of illness.
4. Scrapie tags and ID tags (if separate) will be checked upon entry to the Fairgrounds and BEFORE animals are penned. Animals without correct identification will be sent home immediately. (Scrapie tags are mandatory and must be attached to the animal; unless the animal is registered with a tattoo corresponding to the information on their registration paper.)
5. All market entries will be sold at commercial market price and breeding class entries will be released at the end of their respective competitions and must be removed from the premises at the close of the Fair on the day of the competition.
6. All participants are expected to complete their own record report by Monday, September 28, 2011. Failure to do so will result in loss of any additional show and sale money. Books will be returned to participants at the annual Isle of Wight County 4H Recognition Event.
7. 4H attire is expected of all show persons. 4H attire is a white shirt, dark pants, appropriate shoes, and optional green tie.
8. Showmanship participation is MANDATORY in all 4H shows.
9. Good sportsmanship is expected at all times. The show committee will handle any disagreement with judges AFTER the show.
10. The show committee reserves the right to further divide classes if deemed necessary.
11.
